Wet Weather

Just a reminder to all families regarding rainy day plans.

- Please be sure to send your child with a change of clothes for those unexpected accidents outside during play time.
- While we do hold inside play times during heavy downpours, we recognize that all children benefit from fresh air and outside time, so we encourage rain boots and good outdoor clothes, such as a rainproof jacket, for those days when we will all head outside in rainy weather. And for our youngest Prospect Lake students, mud pants or splash pants are a great idea.
- Staff will let students know at 8:25-to the bell if they should come on in to their class and enjoy a quiet activity (any activity outlined by their classroom teacher for quiet time after lunch is expected). Staff who would normally be outside on supervision will be circulating to supervise students.

Emergency Preparedness

As part of the district emergency preparedness we have procedures in place to ensure the safety and well-being of your child(ren) and staff in the event of an emergency. The students at Prospect Lake practice fire drills, earthquake drills and lock down/hold and secure drills throughout the year. The students have participated in 2 fire drills and earthquake drill to date. As part of the Great Shakeout, student's practiced Duck, Cover and Hold and counted to sixty following a shake. Parking lot reminders and NEW Kindergarten walkers

As it can be very congested at drop off and pick up, please use the *Drop Off Zone* by pulling forward to the crosswalk and have children exit the car on your passenger side for everyone's safety. Please have children use the crosswalk when you are dropping your child off in the morning. To help with kindergarten drop off, there will be Student Safety Ambassadors who will trained to safely walk your child from the cross walk to the supervised play areas prior to the bell starting the week of October 30. Ways to help with congestion:
