Reporting On Student Progress

Although teachers continually use a variety of assessment strategies to guide their instruction, November is a month when they will be reporting about your child's progress in a formal manner. Individual student reports will be sent home in late November and, as you may encounter terminology such as assessment and evaluation during this time, it is important to understand that they represent different aspects of determining a student's progress. Assessment is a formative process of collecting information that a child knows, is able to do and is learning to do. This information is gathered in many ways and is used by both the child and teacher to develop effective learning plans. Evaluation is the process of making judgments and decisions on a child's progress based on evidence gathered for the purpose of goal setting or reporting. The teacher or the student may do evaluation independently or in collaboration. Finally, reporting is the process of presenting and communicating information about a student's learning and progress, gained through evaluation and based on identified standards. Reporting may be done in writing, through a conference or informally. The processes of assessment, evaluation and reporting are ongoing but parents will receive three formal written reports each year in November, March and June.
