WHOLE SCHOOL INQUIRY FIELD TRIP

We are excited for our field trip in exploring the local watershed on May 25. We have partnered up with our own Jenny Eastman, Project Wet, Peninsula Stream Keepers, Friends of Tod Creek, Rocky Point Bird Observatory, and Power to Be.

Our primary students will visit 2 sites at the start of the Tod Creek Watershed where they will explore insects, native flora and invasive plants.

Our intermediates will visit 4 sites throughout the watershed and explore bird identification, fish ladders and preservation of the watershed.

The whole school will meet at Power to Be on Prospect Lake to have lunch and continue with further activities for the afternoon that will solidify the learning from the morning sites that students have visited. - Composition issues- to the best of our ability we consider balance of gender, behaviour, social emotional, learning needs and balance of numbers for multi age class and overall class size
