Artist in Residence

"Classroom without Borders"- We are pleased to have received a grant for this whole school project from ArtStarts and support from the PAC. Our Artist in Residence this year is Renee Sala and we will start work on this project May 25- June 18. All students from K- 5 will work with Renee for 3.5 hours. This Project is inspired by the students' real life experiences in their outdoor learning space. Stories told through pictures and words will help connect students to their environment and the students will create a collaborative felt mural depicting our Learning Community which includes the school, outdoor learning place, garden, stream and forest. We will focus on enriching our positive sense of community and celebrating of the efforts of the students in an engaging learning environment. *A similiar Whole School project was done at Sidney School called "Food Forest" 2 years ago and a sample of a collaborative mural looks like this:*



Whole school Inquiry

Learning about our local Watershed- This is a year long focus on water conservation and learning about our local watershed. 

Floor hockey Thanks to Mrs. Lail for sponsoring the Grade 3,4,5 intermurals at lunch on Wednesdays.




