- Yvonne:
  - Micro flower grower,

**Digital Literacy for Prospect Lake School** Our Teacher librarian Mrs. Bourdon and Mrs. Close met with our district staff Ms. MacNee to put together an AMAZING resource for Prospect Lake. It's user friendly and to be taught cross curricular from K-5. It fits well with the new curriculum and includes great resources. Teachers are excited to use this resource.

**Applied Skills and Design**: Prospect Lake has joined the highly successful Saanich Schools **Primary MakeDo and Intermediate Tool Cart Initiatives.** 

- In the MakeDo project, primary students prototype, build, test, and refine their skills such
  as planning, measuring and building. Students use cardboard and 3D printed tools,
  designed for little hands, to drill, saw and attach pieces together with screws and
  screwdrivers.
- With the Tool Carts, intermediate students learn hands-on skills and gain experience building using tools such as hammers, hand saws, scroll saws, drill presses, jigsaws, cordless drills and screwdrivers. Tool Cart projects have included book stands, canoe paddles, flower vases and ping pong paddles.

# HEALTH AND SAFETY (as posted on School Website Feb 8, 2021) As you know there were CHANGES TO SOME COVID SAFETY PROTOCOLS AND NEW HEALTH CHECK APP

MASKS: Please note that elementary students are not required to wear a mask in schools or on school buses. Elementary students' mask use is based on personal or family/caregiver choice, and this choice will continue to be respected.

**Elementary staff**, however, must wear a mask when on a school bus and when inside and outside of their learning group (cohort) except when:

- Sitting in (or standing at) their seat or desk/workstation in a classroom or learning space
- There is a barrier in place
- Eating or drinking
- When outside

Adult visitors inside the school must also wear a mask.

**NEW MOBILE HEALTH CHECK APP:** Implementation and further communication of the new protocols will occur over the next few weeks. Starting Monday, February 8th, families are encouraged to download and use daily this new mobile

Health Check App. (The link is also posted on the front page of our school website)

#### **DROP OFF AND PICK UP**

We greatly appreciate the concerted effort by all in decreasing the density on the school grounds! We continue to fine tune this practice to meet the PHO orders and school Health and Safety. Thank you to all parents/visitors who continue to:

- Arrive at the drop off and pick up times to support the staggered times
  - If you are early for pick up please wait in your cars rather than the school grounds to support staggered exit
- Encourage your child to independently head to the drop off areas in the morning
  - Use the drop of lanes, supervisors are there to help
- Introduce your kindergartener /grade 1 to the Morning walkers if needed
- Head off the school grounds and surrounding fields at dismissal time
- Wear a mask while on the school grounds, as this is encouraged

#### **PARKING LOT**

We have had some near misses at the crosswalk and blocking the drive through lane. With more foot traffic using the crosswalks and we are discouraging cars from turning right into the roundabout from the left hand "drive through" lane (often in front of the school busses) during the busy drop off and pick up times. Welcome to the February Confederation Of Parents Advisory Council of Saanich's (COPACS) report.

At each monthly meeting, we are fortunate to have members from the Saanich School District and the Board of Trustees join us and present updates and new information, along with members from other PACs and guest speakers.

A PAC parent, Adam Addleston, gave a presentation on a PACE FC (Passion Attitude Commitment Energy Football Club) Fundraiser for SD63 PACs. PACE FC is a local, non-profit, house league club, who are willing to donate part of the fee from there soccer registration back to the corresponding school's PAC. Enrollment is \$100, which in turn will provide \$15 to that child's school (you note *Prospect Lake Elementary School* on your child's registration form). Further information can be found at <a href="https://www.pacefc.com">www.pacefc.com</a> and registration is now open for the 2021 Season. Their goal is to make soccer accessible to everyone!

Superintendent Dave Eberwein provided us with his monthly update...

- 1. COVID-19: Dr. Henry and Minister Whiteside's safety protocol update came out and had a focus on crowd prevention strategies, reminders to avoid face-to-face contact, continue to physical distance as masks do no prevent that, and a reminder to keep students spread out as much as possible. The new mask protocol requires our staff team to always wear masks indoors except for when they are at their workstation (a space away from the children where they are not actively interacting or speaking with them).
- 2. Masks: A question was posed asking if SD63 will make it mandatory for parents to wear masks while on the exterior of the school property, not just while inside. The answer was no. The district strongly encourages anyone going onto school property to wear a mask. It is up to our school body and PACs to have the conversations and encourage people to wear them while they are on our properties and to remind about social distancing as well.
- 3. 2021-2022 School Year: There will be a survey coming out for all students, parents, and staff. The focus is on what did or did not work well during our COVID year that might work or not work in the next school year. What have we learned? What could we keep and continue with? What could we modify or enhance? For example, the staggered drop off and pick-up times at Prospect Lake, is this something that could benefit the school for future years with regards to spreading out the parking lot at drop off and at pick up?
